

Fall Colors Ride and Drive

October 10-11-12, 2008

Head to southwest Idaho for the first annual Fall Colors Ride and Drive!

Two days of riding or driving on easy railroad grade along the Weiser River. Riders, wagons, carts, buggies welcome. Preregister by October 3, \$80 per entrant. After October 3, add \$10. No refunds. Extra T-shirts and meals only available for nonriders (see entry form).

Friday, October 10: Gather in Midvale on highway 95 north of Weiser. Camp in the park. Horses may be high-lined or tied to trailers or hitching rails. Horse water available. Catered dinner will be served at 7:30 p.m. Short ride meeting following dinner. Please note we are camping alongside a major highway and all horses must be securely tied or contained.

Saturday, October 11: Catered breakfast at 8 a.m. Ride to Cambridge (9 miles) for optional participation in Harvest Celebration and noon parade. Return to Midvale at your leisure. Catered dinner in Midvale at 7 p.m.

Sunday, October 12: Catered breakfast at 8 a.m. Ride south as far as you wish and return to Midvale.

You furnish your own clean hay (need not be certified weed free) and camp gear. RVs OK. Parking free. Port-A-Potty and horse water in camp. Due to our commitments for services, we cannot make refunds after October 3. This is a family outing and we ask everyone to conduct themselves accordingly. As a favor to us, please make copies of this sheet and pass around your area. Each participant will receive a commemorative T-shirt.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SUBMITTING ENTRY FORM:

WAGONS/CARTS/BUGGIES: Check your width. Trestles are only eight feet wide in places.

CHILDREN: This is a family event and children are welcome BUT young children must be under direct adult supervision at *all times*.

DOGS: Please leave your dogs at home.

RIDERS: Helmets strongly recommended for all riders.

OK TO BRING:

- ❖ Camping equipment
- ❖ RVs
- ❖ Cell Phone or Two-Way Radio (please note cell phone service can be limited)
- ❖ Picket Line
- ❖ First Aid Kit
- ❖ Camp Chairs
- ❖ Drinking Water
- ❖ Cameras
- ❖ Bug Spray
- ❖ Flashlight
- ❖ Hay/grain

PLEASE DO NOT BRING:

- ❖ Lamé, sick or stud horses
- ❖ Horses with a history of unsoundness
- ❖ People who think this is a horse race
- ❖ Firearms
- ❖ Dogs
- ❖ People who complain, tire easily or who can't keep up
- ❖ Hames, collars or saddles that don't fit
- ❖ Horses that pull back
- ❖ Overloaded wagons or carts

STRONGLY RECOMMENDED: Hoof protection. The trail is an old rail bed. IT IS ROCKY. This is not the place to test your barefoot horse theories.

PLEASE NOTE: The Wagon Master has the final authority at all times. If he deems your horse unfit to join the ride or unfit to continue, you will be excused from the ride and drive. This is not negotiable.

If you have any questions, please inquire before registering. We appreciate your cooperation. Our first priority is the safety of all participants and their equines. ☺
